SCHEDULE 19 – MUNICIPAL STREET LIGHTING

Availability

Available to towns, villages, and communities within the District's Service Area for street lighting service from dusk to dawn.

Type of Service and Street Lights

Single-phase, 60 cycles, at available secondary voltages including the furnishing and maintaining of mercury vapor and incandescent lamps with luminaries and bracket attachments on wooden poles.

Monthly Rate

Incandescent:

- 60 watt lamp @ \$ 5.77
- 100 watt lamp @ \$ 7.37
- 133 watt lamp @ \$ 7.71
- 150 watt lamp @ \$ 7.97
- 200 watt lamp @ \$ 8.63
- 300 watt lamp @ \$10.82

Mercury Vapor:

- 175 watt lamp @ \$ 9.89
- 250 watt lamp @ \$11.62
- 400 watt lamp @ \$14.59

High Pressure Sodium:

- 100 watt lamp @ \$ 8.82
- 250 watt lamp @ \$12.36
- 400 watt lamp @ \$15.27

Additional Street Lights

Service will be furnished for additional lights at above rates provided the required extensions of the street lighting circuits do not exceed 300 feet per light.

Late Charge

If payment is not received by the due date as indicated on the bill, 5% will be added to the bill as a late charge.

Municipal Agreement Charge

Where the District has an agreement to pay the municipalities a percentage of the customer's retail revenue, such percentage will be added to each customer's bill before application of a fuel and production cost adjustment.

In Lieu of Tax Charge

If a customer resides within the corporate limits of an incorporated town or village, the customer will be charged an additional 5% of the customer's monthly charge plus or minus any fuel and production cost adjustment, since the District is required to remit this amount to the County in which the customer resides.

Service Regulations

The District's Service Regulations form a part of this Schedule.
